## ABOUT THE PROJECT

This project bringed together citizens from two very successful municipalities Verbania from Italy and Mindelheim from Germany, giving them the opportunity to discover their cultural diversity and remind them that European values and cultural heritage are the foundation of a common future, to strengthen mutual understanding and friendship. to their citizens and to encourage cooperation between them and the exchange of examples of good practice. Gathering citizens of different nationalities who participated in joint activities was effective to raise awareness of the richness of culture and languages in Europe, which was the primary priority of the project and oriented the discussions on what kind of Europe we want as European citizens from Italy and Germany.

The project organized a three-day international conference "European future through friendships at the local level" in the town of Verbania, Italy, the Municipality of Verbania. The conference resulted in bringing together 56 guest participants from Germany, the city of Mindelheim and 94 local citizens. There were a **total of 150 direct participants in the event**. **The project gathered 2 partners from 2 EU member states: Italy and Germany. 15,000 citizens indirectly benefited from this Project**. Within the Conference, the project organized a panel discussion: "European identity as we see it" where participants, representatives of different cultures and communities establish democratic dialogue and common relations.

The debate about the Future of Europe and the new generations gave participants the opportunity to discuss how to support European integration.

The discussion was based on concrete achievements of the EU and scientific lessons from history, as well as on trends that call into question its achievements. Within the Conference, some round tables are held on the following topics: exchange of experiences of young people in volunteering and active participation programs, lifelong learning toward better living conditions and young people as active citizens of the community.

## **Participants:**

We had a total number **56 Germans and 94 Italian** participants supported from the sending and hosting organizations. Participants were aged from 18 years old to any age. Medium average age was at around 18-19 years old.

This activity was aimed at providing the twinning participants with the chance to work in international team, consisting of German and Italian learners, with the possibility to share and compare your experiences in the Eu lifelong learning systemworld, looking for similarities and differences between the Italian and the German educational system in the framework of the European educational system and in a lifelong learning perspective. Participants were asked to share their experiences and try to find out some strength elements toward the best Eu lifelong learning system/ lifelong learning model in Europe, able to support them, as European citizens, able to study, volunteer and work in any Eu country. 


The visual project could be a visual creation (a photograph, a painting, a drawing, a collage ecc...) accompanied by a short text in English to give a background explanation of the image.

Outcome: results from the Session about needs and project ideas on topics such as training mobility, inclusion, participation, culture. Results of the project design "gym" activity

Each group had the task of planning a project idea, starting from a problem actually felt in its own territory, transforming the problem into an objective, identifying a target and planning the activities that allow the objective to be achieved.

Working groups were aimed at jointly developing some project ideas, finding out some common interests connecting Italian and German participants, objectives and priorities between participants from the two countries on the following topics: learning mobility, inclusion, participation and culture.

The discussion took place on topics of common interest that connect the participants from Italy and Germany, and around which the kids want to discuss. The discussion started from the comparison of the previous experiences gained abroad or in an intercultural framework, in the view of helping the young people to share experiences as well as to help them to decide whether they want to organize a European group cultural exchange or an international volunteering project. The participants were thus helped to discuss the issues of volunteering and European citizenship. Furthermore, discussion was stimulated on the type of target of young people from Germany and Italy to be involved in any projects activated as a development and follow-up action resulting from the town twinning.

We thus attempted to identify the type of target to be involved by asking to the participants the following sub-questions:

What type of young people do you think can participate more frequently/ or is / are more interested in participating in intercultural comparison opportunities / in your opinion is there any

type of target for young people who have less ease/possibility of accessing opportunities for European citizenship, volunteering abroad or intercultural learning. Specific attention was devoted to thinking about inclusion objectives for young people with fewer opportunities so as to include them to access intercultural education, and in order to bring them closer to the available chances for European training mobility and volunteering programs abroad.

The young people also discussed about the main barriers to European mobility encountered by young people in their area. Another topic addressed was that of lifelong learning, analyzing what the participants believe they can learn thanks to cultural exchange experiences or volunteering abroad. It was thus highlighted what changes could be generated at an individual and group level in the participants involved in a cultural exchange, volunteering or democratic participation project for young people from different countries.

The final aim was to highlight what changes we would like to generate in the communities of the two cities involved in the twinning, giving value to the presence of young people from another country as a resource to help in raising public awareness of the respective cities on intercultural issues, as well as on the value of cultural diversity and European citizenship. The results of the comparison were translated by each working group into the clear identification of European project ideas, with the definition of objectives and the changes they would like to produce in themselves, in the group of young people and in the community participating in the exchange.

The project ideas were developed by the working groups also with the definition of priority themes of interest, types of activities to be organized within the respective projects, opportunities and ideas for extending the impacts of the project even beyond the targets of the direct protagonists, also including young people who do not directly participate in the initiatives.

Furthermore, the project ideas were defined and described by the working groups also in terms of the final event of the projects, which can be activated in order to actively involve the community stakeholders from Italy and Germany.

Finally, the participants confronted which entities, both at a local and both at national or European level, could support the implementation of their project ideas (supply of funds, equipment, skills, thus identifying any local, national or European partners who they intend to be involved in supporting the them emerged project ideas).

#### **Conclusions**

Main project ideas emerged from the activities are referred to youth exchanges focused on the following topics: green, inclusion, digital, culture.

The proposed activities have as a key and main common element the possibility to use the art, and creativity as strategic resources so as to overcome the language and cultural barriers connected to diversity from Italy and Germany. All projects give value to intercultural learning and the use of formal education methods and practices. Projects ideas are generally aimed at valuing the youth ideas and proposals toward social innovation impacts applied to multiple issues with special regard to digital and green transition and the inclusion of disadvantaged targets. Expected impacts are also referred to the respective local communities from Italy and German in the view to increase awareness about cultural diversity.
